## **Dividend Frequently Asked Questions**

### **When will I receive my third quarter fiscal 2019 dividend payment?**

The dividend declared on March 6, 2019 will be paid on May 17, 2019 to shareholders of record on April 17, 2019. You should receive your dividend payment on or shortly after May 17, 2019.

### **Will Comtech pay dividends going forward?**

Future dividends remain subject to compliance with financial covenants under the Company's secured credit facility, as well as Board approval.

### **Does Comtech have a dividend re-investment plan?**

At present, Comtech does not have a dividend re-investment plan.

### **Can I request direct deposit of my dividend payment if I am a registered shareholder?**

If you are a registered shareholder, you can request direct deposit of your dividend payment by contacting our stock transfer agent, American Stock Transfer & Trust Co. ### **I am a registered shareholder and believe my dividend check has been lost or stolen. What should I do?**

### **I hold my Comtech shares in "street name" in a brokerage account. How will I receive my dividend payment?**

Contact your broker to determine how you will receive your dividend payment.

### **When will I receive my Form 1099-DIV and who will I receive it from?**

If you are a registered shareholder, you will receive your Form 1099-DIV from our stock transfer agent, American Stock Transfer & Trust Co. ("AST"), by the end of January each year for dividends paid in the preceding year. If you hold your Comtech shares in "street name" in a brokerage account, please contact your broker.

### **How do I report the dividend payment for tax purposes?**
